Assessment at WSU

Overseen by the Office of the Provost and Executive Vice President, WSU has a highly flexible system for the program-level assessment of student learning. Departments and schools have primary responsibilities to develop, implement, and use meaningful assessment in degree programs, in ways that address their unique needs and contexts within frameworks of good practice.

Program faculty drive the assessment of student learning. They have a central role in identifying learning outcomes and assessment questions, conducting assessment, interpreting results, and making decisions to improve their programs. Assessment data can help faculty recognize program strengths, identify challenges, and refine instructions and curricula in order to deliver relevant and powerful learning experiences to all students.

Department chairs and school directors oversee the design, implementation, and use of program-level assessment of student learning outcomes for their unit's degrees to support quality curricula and student learning achievement to meet the evolving needs of students and disciplines.
