Reminder: 2024 Undergraduate Degree Program Assessment Reporting Window Open

WSU undergraduate degree programs are responsible for reporting annually on program-level assessment, submitting a report during the open reporting window — **anytime from mid-December 2024 through February 2025**. Undergraduate programs will again use Qualtrics to submit their 2024 annual report about program assessment conducted during the 2024 calendar year (Jan 1 – Dec 31) and program assessment coordinators received emails from ace.office@wsu.edu in mid-December with unique links to access the Qualtrics form.

Program Assessment Spotlight: Engaging Faculty in Curriculum Mapping (Strategic Communication)

Curriculum mapping is a vital tool for academic programs, offering a clear alignment between program-level student learning outcomes (SLOs) and the courses within a degree program. Simplified, a curriculum map is a matrix that visually represents how each course in a program contributes to the overarching program-level SLOs. The complexity of these maps can vary to best suit the needs of a program, but their primary function is to enable faculty to design intentional curricula that systematically build and deepen students' skills and knowledge throughout the undergraduate experience, leading to mastery of program-level SLOs. By making this relationship visible, curriculum maps empower faculty to create a cohesive learning experience that appropriately scaffolds student achievement of key educational goals.

Following a refresh of the program-level SLOs for the BA in Strategic Communication by program faculty, WSU's Department of Strategic Communication undertook an initiative to update their curriculum maps during the 2023-24 academic year for their four majors: Advertising, Public Relations, Integrated Strategic Communication, and Risk & Crisis Communication. The faculty assessment coordinator began by reviewing syllabi from all required courses for each of the four majors, using a curriculum mapping template adapted from WSU's Office of Assessment for Curricular Effectiveness. This involved entering course-level SLOs from the syllabi into the template and aligning these with the program-level SLOs. A pilot phase was conducted where the faculty assessment coordinator met with faculty teaching specific courses to review this alignment and discuss how course assignments support program-level SLOs. Curriculum Mapping Toolkit: Resources for Developing and Updating Curriculum Maps

Curriculum maps help faculty understand the specific role courses play within the broader curriculum, clarifying how their teaching contributes to the advancement of program-level SLOs. Additionally, curriculum maps can be used to help investigate assessment findings and plan interventions to address identified gaps or areas for improvement. For example, program faculty can use the curriculum map to explore the following questions:

- When is competency expected and how do prior course learning experiences help ensure success?
- Are program SLOs first introduced and then reinforced? Do students get practice on program SLOs before being assessed for competency?
- Do some program SLOs get more coverage than others? Is that intentional?

Mark Your Calendars for NSSE 2025 Promotion

This spring, plan to help get the word out to eligible seniors and first-year students on all WSU campuses about NSSE 2025! **The main window for NSSE 2025 promotion will be in March and early April**, and the nsse.wsu.edu website will have additional information about key dates and materials to help faculty and staff promote the NSSE 2025 survey at WSU.

Every two years, WSU participates in the [National Survey of Student Engagement \(NSSE\)](#) to help assess senior and first-year student engagement in educational practices associated with high levels of learning and development. After each administration, our office collaborates with WSU's Office of Institutional Research to disaggregate results for undergraduate degree programs and colleges, focusing on responses from seniors. These disaggregated NSSE reports are distributed to WSU programs in which 10 or more seniors respond to the survey. Recognition of Program Assessment Activities in Faculty Annual Review

[WSU's faculty manual](#) provides recognition for faculty participation in program-level assessment in the annual review process, as part of Teaching or Service accomplishments, depending on the activity. This aligns with the [university's EPPM](#) policies on assessment, which include recognizing assessment work in annual review at all levels.

Additionally, Activity Insight includes drop-down menus and built-in prompts for reporting assessment activities connected to teaching and curriculum in the *Teaching/Mentoring* section, as well as the ability to report work coordinating assessment and serving on related committees in the *Service* section. Dec	Mid Dec	Program assessment coordinators receive an email from ACE with a unique link to their 2024 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reporting form in Qualtrics. Assessment coordinators can submit their report during the open reporting window — anytime from mid-Dec 2024 through Feb 2025 .
Jan	3 rd 6 th	Fall 2024 [CAPS] Assessment Reports for UCORE are due (i.e., reporting closes). First day of instruction for the spring term.
Feb	1 st Early Feb 4 th Late Feb 28 th	Spring submission deadline for major Curricular Change Requests for new and revised courses. Fall 2024 [CAPS] instructors receive a pdf copy of their [CAPS] Assessment Report for UCORE from UCORE via email. <i>Note: Typically, assessment in a [CAPS] course for majors can contribute toward degree program-level assessment of student learning – see our resource related to [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE as part of degree program assessment.</i> Deadline for undergraduate students to drop a course without record. Spring 2025 [CAPS] instructors receive an email from UCORE with initial information about [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE for the spring term. 2024 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reports are due (i.e., reporting closes). Assessment coordinators (or another knowledgeable assessment contact) need to be available to answer questions until March 31 .
March	3 rd	NSSE 2025 opens at WSU. Faculty and staff can help promote NSSE to eligible seniors and first-year students on all WSU campuses.
April	11 th Mid to Late April Late April 25 th	Deadline for undergraduate students to withdraw from a course. Each program will receive a PDF copy of their final 2024 Undergraduate Program Assessment Report from ACE for their continued use and archive. Spring 2025 [CAPS] instructors receive their link to the [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE form in Qualtrics via email (i.e., reporting opens). Last day of instruction for the term.
May	6 th 15 th	Final grade submission ends. Spring 2025 [CAPS] Assessment Reports for UCORE are due (i.e., reporting closes).
