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New Resource: AI Tools and Prompts to Support Program Assessment Activities

AI tools have the potential to support a variety of program assessment activities throughout the assessment cycle. Our new [AI Tools and Prompts to Support Program Assessment Activities](#) resource is intended to help WSU programs and faculty explore these new opportunities in the context of program-level learning outcomes assessment activities. For each of the provided prompts, you'll find a description of the intent of the prompt, the output it is designed to generate, any information you'll be asked to provide, and a document with the prompt text to copy and paste into WSU Copilot Chat.

Currently available prompts include:

- Program SLO development and feedback
- Assessment plan development and feedback
- Open-ended survey response analysis
- 2025 Annual program assessment reporting narrative development

Support for 2025 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reporting

WSU undergraduate programs are responsible for reporting annually on program-level assessment, submitting a report during the open reporting window — **anytime from mid-Dec 2025 through Feb 2026**. Undergraduate programs will again use Qualtrics to submit their 2025 annual report about program assessment conducted during the 2025 calendar year (Jan 1 – Dec 31) and program assessment coordinators received emails from ace.office@wsu.edu in mid-December with unique links to access the Qualtrics form.

One goal of WSU's annual undergraduate program assessment reporting is to document regular assessment activities and uses as required by our institutional accreditor, the [Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities \(NWCCU\)](#). Reports submitted by undergraduate programs in recent years, as well as the reports due in February about 2025 activities, will provide key evidence to demonstrate an effective, regular, and comprehensive system of assessment of student achievement.

Recognition of Program Assessment Activities in Faculty Annual Review

[WSU's faculty manual](#) provides recognition for faculty participation in program-level assessment in the annual review process, as part of Teaching or Service accomplishments, depending on the activity. This aligns with the [university's EPPM](#) policies on assessment, which include recognizing assessment work in annual review at all levels.

Additionally, Activity Insight includes drop-down menus and prompts for reporting assessment activities connected to teaching and curriculum in the *Teaching/Mentoring* section, as well as the ability to report work coordinating assessment and serving on related committees under *Service*. Dec	Mid Dec	Program assessment coordinators receive an email from ACE with a unique link to their 2025 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reporting form in Qualtrics. Assessment coordinators can submit their report during the open reporting window — anytime from mid-Dec 2025 through Feb 2026 .
Jan	9 th	Fall 2025 [CAPS] Assessment Reports for UCORE are due (i.e., reporting closes).
	12 th	First day of instruction for the spring term.
Feb	1 st	Spring submission deadline for major Curricular Change Requests for new and revised courses.
	Early Feb	Fall 2025 [CAPS] instructors receive a pdf copy of their [CAPS] Assessment Report for UCORE from UCORE via email. <i>Note: Typically, assessment in a [CAPS] course for majors can contribute toward degree program-level assessment of student learning – see our resource related to [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE as part of degree program assessment.</i>
	10 th	Deadline for undergraduate students to drop a course without record.
	Late Feb	Spring 2026 [CAPS] instructors receive an email from UCORE with initial information about [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE for the spring term.
	28 th	2025 Undergraduate Program Assessment Reports are due (i.e., reporting closes). Assessment coordinators (or another knowledgeable assessment contact) need to be available to answer questions until March 31 .
April	10 th	Deadline for undergraduate students to withdraw from a course.
	Mid to Late April	Each program will receive a PDF copy of their final 2025 Undergraduate Program Assessment Report from ACE for their continued use and archive.
	Late April	Spring 2026 [CAPS] instructors receive their link to the [CAPS] Assessment Reporting for UCORE form in Qualtrics via email (i.e., reporting opens).
May	1 st	Last day of instruction for the term.
	12 th	Final grade submission ends.
	15 th	Spring 2026 [CAPS] Assessment Reports for UCORE are due (i.e., reporting closes).
